Board President, Brian Glass, opened the meeting.

Minutes were read and approved

Brian announced that the CAN annual meeting will be held in February and election for vacant director's seat will be held. A board appointment is in progress for the other vacant director's seat. Please plan to submit nominations in January's meeting with brief bio for election.

Lydia Meredith chair of the Fire Victim's committee gave a report. CAN plans to purchase a \$50 Target gift card for each registered family of Bedford Pine that was burned out. Furniture has been delivered to some families. (However furniture needs are still unmet!) All clothing needs have been met by community.

Linda Terrill passed out sample written media to use in connection with membership drive. Cards will be mailed out and capability will be put in place to join CAN online. Linda Terrill urged members to go onto our website. Website postings include Minutes, Upcoming event, Membership, Accomplishment/Events (i.e. Donations to neighborhood schools (C. W. Hill and John Hope School Elementary) to help schools reach attendance goals.

Ms. Firestone suggested public safety meetings be held at the Waterford from 6p to 630p before each CAN meeting.

Luke asked for recap of October's meeting discussion of the shelter. Brian summarized Debi's comments (no progress working with Anita in 12 years. Expects that Gateway will be converted to male facility and Peachtree-Pine into a female facility. Major Hagen advised against community patrol.

Cedric Stallworth discussed need for planning to eliminate vice on the Boulevard Corridor. Stated Wingate (Bedford Pine owners) may revisit 100% Section 8 use; and move toward redevelopment of 74 buildings.

Kwanza Hall committed his office to head committee to alleviate Boulevard Corridor issue and work toward a solution for the Peachtree Pine Shelter issue. Brian stated that CAN would commit up to \$7500 matching dollars for planning to eliminate vice on the Boulevard corridor.
