

Minutes
Central Atlanta Neighbors
Feb 5, 2004

The meeting was called to order at 6:40 pm. The minutes were approved as presented.

Lew George encouraged everyone to join the yahoo groups mailing list and visit the website.

Several Atlanta Police Officers were present at the meeting and gave reports on new officer assignments. The group also discussed several troublesome properties, including

339 Angier

467 Felton and others.

Paul Finch gave the security patrol report, and indicated that the society vehicle was an asset as it increases visibility of the patrols and allows the officers to go into the parks. He encouraged all to let Lew George know of any troublesome areas and they will give extra attention to those areas. He suggested working with neighboring security patrols to conduct "thunder runs" this summer.

He also reported that the Music Midtown presence may affect the security patrol schedules.

Zelda Jackson gave a report on several properties:

494 Wabash Avenue may be in the 4th Ward neighborhood.

341 Angier- Zelda felt that this property was no longer an issue

339 Angier has been secured and has been issued a nuisance petition

520 Angier may or may not be an infraction; JoLee Gardner will report back to Zelda.

Zelda also reported that Kwanzaa Hall was to meet with the officials at CW Hill where a tutor was mugged, and reported that the city was offering to help with discounts to senior citizens who may be affected by the water rate increases.

The Safety Committee will start fundraising soon to keep the patrol going.

The Parks Committee reported on additional lights that had been fixed or replaced.

The Finance Committee gave the treasurer's report.

The Communications Committee will be compiling newsletters and developing a communications strategy. Jeffrey Jones asked for any and all interested parties to join the committee.

Eric Jensen, representing Rodney Kazemy requested neighborhood support in the pursuit of a liquor license at 495 Peachtree Street for a new restaurant entitled Picador Café. After much discussion, a motion was made to provide a favorable recommendation and the motion passed.

James Alman, candidate for the Fulton County Superior Court, made a short presentation on his candidacy.

Shanon Marchman reported that Music Midtown and reached an agreement with the neighborhood to provide 2500 3-day passes, which will be sold by the neighborhood for \$30, and a cash donation of \$43,750 to the neighborhood.
