

**Minutes  
Central Atlanta Neighbors  
May 6, 2004**

Lew George welcomed all attendees and opened the meeting. The minutes from the previous meeting were not available, and will be presented at the next meeting.

Kristi Burnham then presented a Treasurer's report, stating that \$240 has been collected in membership dues, and that there were expenses for signs for the meeting, Music Midtown Ticket sales supplies, the State of Georgia Annual Filing fees, and with the Security Patrol. CAN currently has \$71,839.41 in its checking and park pride accounts. Kristi also reported that the board was investigating options for putting the funds in interest bearing accounts.

JoLee Gardner gave the Parks Committee report. JoLee stated that there had been some tree work conducted on Parkway, and that stump grinding was to occur next. She reported that new trees would be planted in the fall, and that the committee was conducting a sidewalk inventory.

Lew George reported on the activities of the Security Patrol. He stated that the patrol was scheduled for different hours and different days during the week, and that the condos that have joined the association are now eligible for coverage by the patrol. All businesses were encouraged to join the association.

Shannon Marchman then reported that Music Midtown 2004 was very successful. She appreciated the cooperation that the neighborhood provided, but did recognize that a few issues occurred this year, especially related to fencing. Shannon presented a check for \$43,750 from Clear Channel to the neighborhood association, and congratulated the neighborhood on its ticket sales. She requested paperwork be faxed to the accounting office, and also requested that CAN write a letter of support at a later date to the City when Music Midtown reapplies for its festival permit.

Several Atlanta Police Officers were present at the meeting and reported that their main focus lately was Renaissance Park and the 500 block of Peachtree Street. Members of CAN inquired about the court watch system.

Lloyd Geddes and Brad Walton requested a favorable recommendation for a liquor license for a new restaurant and bar located at 511 Peachtree Street. After much discussion, the neighborhood passed a motion of support.

Mr. Lee requested a favorable recommendation for a beer and wine license for Aloha located on Piedmont Avenue. After much discussion, the neighborhood passed a motion of support.

Linda Terrill and Rufus Terrill requested a favorable recommendation for a liquor license for O'Terrill's located on Piedmont Avenue across from Renaissance Park. After much discussion, the neighborhood passed a motion of support.

David Norwood requested a favorable recommendation for a liquor license for a beverage service company located in Sci-Trek. After much discussion, the neighborhood passed a motion of support.

Jennifer Ball from Central Atlanta Progress updated the group on Restaurant Week, the week of July 26<sup>th</sup>, and reminded the group of other downtown activities, such as the arts walk, Friday lunch on Broad, etc. Brian glass suggested that CAN write a letter to CAP to encourage ambassadors to be more present near North Avenue.

Mary Yancey reported that Music Midtown was a lot better this year, and is sending a letter to the Atlanta Police department thanking them for their outstanding help this year.

As a reminder, the group discussed Central Park being closed for renovations for 18 months or so.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
